MacKillop Mission



The Journey of Mary MacKillop 1842 – 1909:

On 17 October 2010 Mary MacKillop was recognised by the church as St Mary of the Cross MacKillop. In today's world, Mary stands as an example of great courage and trust in her living out of God's loving and compassionate care of those in need. For families who are beginning their journey with our College this year, we'd like to share a summary of her story with you now, so that you can understand a little more about what inspires and animates us here at MacKillop College.

“On January 15 1842 Mary MacKillop was born of Scottish parents, Alexander MacKillop and Flora MacDonald in Fitzroy, Victoria. This was less than seven years after Fawcner sailed up the Yarra, when Elizabeth Street was a deep gully and Lonsdale Street was still virgin bush. A plaque in the footpath now marks the place of her birth in Brunswick Street, Fitzroy.

Mary, the eldest of eight children, was well educated by her father who spent some years studying for the priesthood in Rome but through ill health had returned to his native Scotland until 1835 when he migrated to Australia with his parents. Unfortunately, he lacked financial awareness, so the family was often without a home of their own, depending on friends and relatives and frequently separated from one another.

From the age of sixteen, Mary earned her living and greatly supported her family, as a governess, as a clerk for Sands and Kenny (now Sands and MacDougall), and as a teacher at the Portland school. While acting as a governess to her uncle's children at Penola, Mary met [Father Julian Tenison Woods](#) who, with a parish of 22,000 square miles/56,000 square kilometre, needed help in the religious education of children in the outback. At the time Mary's family depended on her income so she was not free to follow her dream. However, in 1866, greatly inspired and encouraged by Father Woods, Mary opened the first Saint Joseph's School in a disused stable in Penola.

Young women came to join Mary, and so the Congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph was begun. In 1867, Mary was asked by Bishop Shiel to come to Adelaide to start a school. From there, the Sisters spread, in groups to small outback settlements and large cities around Australia, New Zealand, and now in Peru, Brazil and refugee camps of Uganda and Thailand. Mary and these early Sisters, together with other Religious Orders and Lay Teachers of the time, had a profound influence on the forming of Catholic Education as we have come to know and experience it today. She also opened Orphanages, Providences to care for the homeless and destitute both young and old, and Refuges for ex-prisoners and ex-prostitutes who wished to make a fresh start in life.

Mary, throughout her life, met with opposition from people outside the Church and even from some of those within it.

In the most difficult of times she consistently refused to attack those who wrongly accused her and undermined her work, but continued in the way she believed God was calling her and was always ready to forgive those who wronged her.

Mary, throughout her life, suffered ill health. She died on August 8, 1909 in the convent in Mount Street, North Sydney where her tomb is now enshrined. Since then the Congregation has grown and now numbers about 1200, working mainly in Australia and New Zealand but also scattered singly or in small groups around the world. The "Brown Joeys" may be seen in big city schools, on dusty bush tracks, in modern hospitals, in caravans, working with the "little ones" of God - the homeless, the new migrant, the Aboriginal, the lonely and the unwanted, in direct care and in advocacy, in standing with and in speaking with. In their endeavours to reverence the human dignity of others and to change unjust structures, the Sisters and those many others who also share the Mary MacKillop spirit continue the work which she began." www.sosj.org.au

Careers

Defence Technical Scholarships:

The Department of Defence have now launched their 'Defence Technical Scholarships' for 2012. The scholarships are designed to encourage students to stay at school and complete Year 11 and 12 whilst studying mathematics and technical trade subjects. It is a scholarship focused on students undertaking a technical trade pathway, not a tertiary pathway.

Please note that there is no commitment for you to join the Australian Defence Force; however students must demonstrate an interest in ADF Technical Trades to complete the application process.

The Scholarships provides \$2000 for year 11 and \$3000 for year 12 students and is paid in one cheque at the start of term 2. The application period closes midnight 09 March 2012; therefore it is absolutely essential that all fully completed applications are returned to Ms Sama, Careers Counsellor by 3.30pm on 02 March.

Student Wellbeing - Services

Student services continue to provide support to our students via a whole school approach to wellbeing and practical support. Integration aide assistance in the classroom, counselling services (including On Psych Psychologists), Careers counselling and outside agency support such as Youth Connections and EACH employment are some of the many services available at MacKillop. It is timely to provide parents/guardians with an update on some of the key services we provide.

Counselling

Counselling is available to all students at MacKillop College. Students can self-refer or in partnership with teaching staff can be referred for counselling either during school hours or immediately after school. The school counsellors; Betty Kraveleski, Colin Dunne and Margie O'Loughlin are all located in the Student Services Building. Further support is provided by an outside agency "OnPsych" who work closely with our Student Wellbeing team and Director of Student Services to provide specialist support in adolescent mental health issues. OnPsych are a team of qualified, registered psychologists and social workers that operate alongside our resident counsellors at the College. They work with individual students and their families at no cost to the student or parent/guardian. This requires a referral from your family GP. For referrals and more information contact Kylie Power (Director of Student Services) at kpower@mackillop.vic.edu.au . Rachel Di Natale and Stefania Di Crescenzo are our assigned OnPsych Psychologists.

Integration Aide support

We are fortunate to have ten Integration aides at MacKillop College. Aides are assigned to classes that need extra support and assistance typically in the areas of Literacy and Numeracy. Allocation of aides is coordinated by Kylie Power the Director of Student Services in collaboration with the Individualised Learning Leaders Jan Enright (Year 7 & 8), Julie Lamond (Year 9 & 10) and Mark Westgarth (Year 11 & 12). Allocation

is based on need and is delivered discreetly by the aides who have many years experience working with secondary students.

The aides also offer homework assistance after school "**Study Zone**" runs 3.30-4.30pm Mondays and Thursdays throughout the year.

Careers Counselling

We welcome Tracey Sama, Careers Counsellor and Micarle Callea, Careers Coordinator to the Student Services team. They will assist students and families plan successful pathways for the future.

Parent/Guardian Information

MACKILLOP COLLEGE BOARD – PARENT REPRESENTATIVE

The function of the MacKillop College Board is to provide guidance, advice and bring a range of views that assist in informing some of the decision making processes of the school. The members of the MacKillop College Board are respected for their participation and knowledge and viewed by the Administration of the College as having an essential and significant role to play in the ongoing welfare of the College. We welcome on the Board a Parent/Guardian Representative whose term of office is three years and we call upon all parents/guardians to contemplate taking up this unique and important role at the school. Nomination forms for this post are available from the Principal's Personal Assistant, Mrs Catherine Jack. Alternatively you can contact the College to have a nomination form posted to you. Nominations close on February 17 2012. The Board meets five times per year, the first of which is the Annual General Meeting, March 15 at the College. We thank you in anticipation of your consideration and nomination.

EMA INFORMATION FOR 2012

The Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is provided to assist eligible families with the costs associated with the education of their children.

To be eligible for receipt of the EMA you must:

- be either a parent or guardian of a secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; **and**
- be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004* **or** be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner **or** be a foster parent.

Consequently parents/guardians are able to access the EMA if they have a valid Health Care Card or valid Pension Card.

The eligibility criteria must be met as at the first day of Term 1 (**February 1, 2012**) which is the first day for teaching staff) and Term 3 (**July 16, 2012**).

The EMA application must be submitted to the school by **February 22, 2012** for the first instalment and **July 27, 2012** for the second instalment.

The EMA provides an annual amount of **\$470** for secondary students and is paid in two instalments. This amount is split evenly between the parents/guardians and the school. Students turning 16 years in 2012 will be paid on a pro rata basis. If the parent portion is surrendered to school fees, the school portion will also be credited to the applicant's school account.

SCHOOL START BONUS



The School Start Bonus is provided by the Victorian Government to assist low-income families with the costs associated with their son/daughters starting Prep or Year 7 at a government or non-government school. If you hold a valid Health Care Card or Pension Card, and you have a son/daughter starting Prep or Year 7, you may be eligible to receive this one-off **\$300** payment.

The School Start Bonus will be paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) into your nominated bank account. The School Start Bonus is separate from, and additional to, the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA).

How to Apply: Contact the Administration Office to complete an application form for the EMA/School Start Bonus.

For late enrolments, applications will be accepted until 29 February 2012.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

Conveyance Allowance 2012 Application forms will be distributed to students in the first week of Term 1. Application forms are to be completed and returned to the Administration office by Friday 10 February 2012. EDUCATION TAX REFUND

The Australian Government's Education Tax Refund provides parents with much needed help for education expenses, with refunds of up to \$409 per primary school students and \$818 per secondary school students available at tax time in 2012 if they are eligible for Family Tax Benefit Part A.

On top of the regular items, such as computers, home internet connections, textbooks and stationery, new changes mean that parents can now also be able to claim school-approved uniforms, including hats, footwear and sports uniforms purchased.

If you are eligible please keep your receipts in a safe place to ensure you can claim your ETR.

SCHOOL IMMUNISATION PROGRAM – 2012

Immunisation for all Year 7 and 10 students will take place at the College on Monday 20 February 2012 at 9:00am. Irrespective of whether your son/daughter is to be immunised, all vaccination cards must be signed by the parent/guardian and returned to the College by Monday 13 February 2012. Consent Cards will be distributed to all Year 7 and 10 students.

Year 7 Hepatitis B vaccine: A course of two vaccinations over a period of approximately 6 months are needed to protect against Hepatitis B.

Chickenpox vaccine: Protection against Chickenpox disease

Year 7 (Girls) HPV (Human Papilloma Virus) Gardasil Vaccine

Council's immunisation service will visit MacKillop on three dates 20 February, 28 May and 30 October 2012. On the first and third occasions, Year 7 male students will receive two vaccinations, and the female students will receive three vaccinations. On 28 May only Year 7 females will receive vaccinations.

Year 10 Boostrix (dTpa) Adolescent Diphtheria, Tetanus and acellular Pertussis (Whooping Cough): Protection against Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis (Whooping Cough) on 20 February 2012.
